HOW TO REGISTER

All Caldwell County Summer Exploring programs, except the Anita Alta family day, are free of charge this year.

Registration takes place on Eventbrite, beginning April 22. Then, youth must enroll in 4-H prior to the start of the selected program. Enrollment is free, and can be completed at <u>v2.4honline.com</u>.

JUNIOR LEADERS

Junior Leaders are needed for four Summer Exploring programs this year. They will help lead social time, assist other youth with hands-on activities and practice facilitating skills.

JUNIOR LEADERS:

- Must be at least 12 years old and enrolled in 4-H Online 2.0 by the time they submit their Junior Leader application. Learn more about 4-H Online on the previous page.
- Must have a positive attitude and abide by the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- Will earn \$50 credit (expiring 12/2022) toward any 4-H event, if they finish the summer in good standing. To be in good standing, youth must have exhibited responsibility, reliability and cooperation.

Interested youth should submit an application online by Friday, May 7 at noon. Team training will be in-person Saturday, May 15. It is expected that all new Junior Leaders attend the team training. Returning Junior Leaders are also highly encouraged to attend.

Both new and returning Junior Leaders must complete the application.

PROJECT LEARNING TREE

Youth ages 8-11 can register for Project Learning Tree ® (PLT), an award winning environmental education program! The group will meet at Redwood Park in Hudson on the following Thursdays from 9 a.m. - 11 a.m. this summer: June 10, 17 and 24 and July 8, 15 and 22.

Youth should plan to attend a minimum of five of the six PLT sessions, as space in the program is limited.

ANITA ALTA FAMILY DAY

Enjoy the great outdoors with Caldwell County 4-H on Anita Alta Family Day - Saturday, June 12. There will be a variety of outdoor activities available to families with youth ages 5-18 who attend. The final program schedule will be sent to registrants ahead of the event.

At this event, Caldwell County 4-H is not responsible for youth supervision. Parents/guardians must stay with their youth for the duration of the program.

REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED.

Note: The registration site for Anita Alta Family Day is separate from the Summer Exploring registration site.

The cost is \$20 per family. Volunteers will receive a unique voucher for the cost of their family's registration.

DIRECTIONS FROM US-321 TO ANITA ALTA



- 1. Heading north on US-321 in Lenoir, turn left onto Main Street NW.
- 2. Then, turn right (sharp corner) onto NC 90-W/Valway Road NW.
- 3. After a little more than a mile, turn left to stay on NC 90-W.
- 4. In 4 miles, turn right onto Mulberry Creek Road.
- 5. Drive another 4 miles, and you will arrive at Camp Anita Alta.





EGG-CELLENT POULRTY

Poultry is the No. 1 agricultural commodity in North Carolina by cash receipts, and it is an "egg-cellent" topic to learn about if youth are interested in science, animals and agriculture.

This program will include hands-on activities and allow youth to improve their knowledge of poultry products.

Dates for the workshop are Wednesdays, July 7 and 14 from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. in Lenoir at the Caldwell County Meeting Rooms. Youth must attend both sessions.
